Best Practice – I Title of the Practice: 'One Student, One Plant' under 'Save Plants, Conserve Nature' concept.

Goal:

- 1. To promote awareness on environment.
- 2. To create awareness about conservation of biodiversity.
- 3. To avoid pollution.
- 4. To educate the students about flora & fauna.

The Context:

It is the need of the hour to take care of our green planet earth, as it is important one for the existence of human and other living beings. Modern world should take efforts to protect green planet. Awareness like global warming, ecosystem preservation and environmental assessment must spread among students and society. The plantation is the most important activity to minimize global warming. The awareness programmes are creating interest among students to protect the environment.

The Practice:

The institution is highly conscious of its environmental responsibility. This practice of "One **Student - One Plant**" orients the student community about their responsibility to the environment and makes them active participants in green campus concept by planting trees. A paper on 'Environment Studies' was also introduced in all degree courses by the Govt. of Andhra Pradesh to make the students aware of several aspects like deforestation, dangers of pollution, a threat to ecological balance, etc., emphasizing the importance of conservation of bio-diversity.

Evidence of Success:

The success of the practice is the green and healthy campus itself. The tall trees inhabited by several monkeys create beautiful fresh and pollution-free atmosphere on the campus. Some of the agencies like Mahindra Finance Company, Naidupet town and forestry department spared saplings for plantation on the campus.

The eco-club and NSS unit of the college helps the students to participate in planting the saplings. In addition the college observes one Saturday every month as 'Cleanliness-day' and undertakes plantation programme on the campus.

Uniqueness:

The college undertakes plantation programme every year on 'Vanamahostavam' day.

Problems encountered & resources required:

- Availability of time is the main constraint in the implementation of the practice.
- There is need for well-trained gardener with necessary tools.
- Lack of protection to the college campus.

- Incomplete compound wall surrounding the campus which paves way for trespassers including cattle.
- Lack of proper funding ear marked for this. In spite of all these constraints, still the practice is continued.

Best Practice – II Title of the Practice: 'Establishment of "POOR STUDENT FUND" in the college

Goal:

To identify the students who are financially poor and help them in payment of fee to some extent while joining the college in I year.

The Context:

Nearly 90% of the students who join the college hail from rural areas with poor financial background; they cannot afford to pay even the minimum prescribed fee to the university which the college insists. Such students are identified by the faculty and see that they get benefit from this fund. The college continuously seeks the help of Alumni and also philanthropists for mobilizing funds for this activity.

The Practice:

The senior faculty approaches the donors and alumni for rising of funds. A record is kept under the custody of the Principal and Vice-principal of the college who monitor these activities. Collected amount will be kept in a separate account in the bank. Those students who get benefit of the scheme gets scholarship offered by the government subsequently reimburse the taken amount to the fund. Thus, the amount gets circulated to some extent, paving way for other students to get financial support.

Evidence of Success:

Impressed by the scheme, a philanthropist by name Mr. P. Jaya Prakash, a philanthropist and Secretary, CPDC, donated Rs.10.000/- towards this fund recently which is testimony for this.

Problems encountered & resources required:

No problems are involved in practicing this scheme except financial resources. Mobilizing funds is a very difficult process.
