3.2 Institutional Weakness	 Lack of adequate number of students. Conventional curriculum and lack of reforms in teaching-learning and evaluation process. Limited fund generation for research and other developmental activities. Low computer literacy among students, IT-enabled aids limited in class rooms and Library is to be computerized. 	
3.3 Institutional Opportunities	 College has potential to become hub of educational activities in the region. Scope for wider use of IT application in teaching- learning and administration. Engage in social and economic uplift of rural areas. Tap the potential of all stakeholders including the alumni in the growth and development of the college. Develop entrepreneurial skills in students. 	
3.4 Institutional Challenges	 Attracting adequate number of students to remain viable. Filling up of vacant teaching and non-teaching positions for conduct of effective teaching learning process. To create minimum requisite physical facilities in terms of labs, computers interner connectivity books and journals furniture for students, seating facility for teachers and compound wall for the campus etc., To inculcate a research culture amongst teachers. 	

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Section IV: recommendations for Quality Enhancement of the Institution

- Appointment of permanent faculty members needs to be expedited.
- College may start need based skill development courses like B.C.A. and BBA etc.,
- College needs to prepare a long term perspective plan and work towards achieving it. Infrastructure needs significant improvement and budget allocation for maintaining laboratories and computers be made.
- A Fulltime Librarian be appointed, INFLIBINET facility, E-journals, Research journals, Automation and Expansion of Library be taken up on priority.
- More number of computers need be added, ICT in teaching learning process be introduced and all students be made computer literate.
- Classes for English communicative skills for students and teachers may be started and coaching for competitive exams such as APPSC, UPSC and Banks etc., for students may be
- IQAC be made proactive and sports activities may be emphasised.
- Research culture among the teachers be promoted and more applications for research projects to funding agencies be submitted.
- NCC be started, NSS be made more active and part-time teachers for dance, music and other
- Alumni associations be formed and registered.
